WHEN HARRY WYNN '01 BUS MOVED FROM EASTERN PENNSYLVANIA TO MYRTLE

Beach, S.C., in 2009, his first order of business was to find the local Alumni Association chapter and get involved. But a Google search told him the closest group was in Charleston, nearly 100 miles away. Wynn was surprised but not discouraged. He contacted the Alumni Association and asked about forming a chapter. Nearly three years later, in April of this year, the Greater Myrtle Beach Chapter received its official charter. Here's how Wynn did it—and how you can, too. -MM



MAKE CONTACT

After that initial phone call, Cheryl Stringer '78 Edu, a regional director of volunteer services for the Alumni Association, told Wynn his first step was to reach out to other alums in his area. There were plenty: Stringer sent a list of more than 600 names.



RALLY THE TROOPS

Wynn enlisted the help of four fellow alums he'd met through friends to tackle the list of contacts. Each person called or emailed at least 50 alumni to gauge their interest in joining. "It was time-consuming, but the response we were getting was great," he says.



TEST THE WATERS

During a one-year probationary period, the Alumni Association determines whether a group can meet the minimum requirement of 40 members. Meet-andgreets, football viewing

parties, and a summer picnic helped the Myrtle Beach Chapter attract a core group of about 50 active alums.



CONNECT

When the group hit the one-year mark in March, members celebrated with a dinner at a local Italian restaurant. For some members, the event was the first chance to meet face-to-face. It was also an opportunity to plan future events, which Wynn says will include a kickball league, baseball game outings, and community service projects.
